

Halloween Jewellery



Ingredients...

Plastic Halloween shapes

I bought this bag for £1 from the pound shop

Black chain
Black clasp
large jumprings (10mm)
ear wires



Earrings...



Select your chosen shapes – I chose skeletons that already had a loop in the top. If your shape doesn't have a loop it's easy to drill a hole or make a hole with a sharp object

Open the loop of your ear wire

Attach your shape, making sure it's facing the right way.

Close the loop and wear your earrings – simple as that!

Necklace...



Choose an odd number of shapes – I chose seven, varying in size

Some of mine had a loop on the back so they could be worn as a ring – cut this off



Drill/make a hole in the top of each shape

Cut the chain to your desired length

Attach a clasp to one end with a jump ring – the clasp will secure the necklace by attaching to any link of the chain so you can vary the length of the necklace

Find the centre of the chain and attach the largest Halloween shape with a large jump ring

Attach all the other shapes to the chain to make your Halloween necklace.

You could also make a Halloween bracelet in exactly the same way but with a shorter length of chain



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
