



## Quick & Easy Fathers Day Cards from the kids

### Ingredients -

- Patterned paper (I used Sassafras Robotics)
- Cardstock (I made mine into a square card)
- Chipboard Alphas (anything that co-ordinates)
- About an hour of your time (if that)

To make the black card I cut out some rockets and a tiny robot. I cut a smaller square of orange patterned paper and distressed all the edges and adhered to the centre of my square card.

I hand drew a circle and cut it out. I put glue on the top half and foam pads on the bottom half of the back and adhered to my card. I did the same with the red rocket (foam pads at the top, glue at the bottom) so that it was poking through the circle.

The larger rocket with 'one' was placed in the corner and chipboard alphas used for my wording.

### Tools for the job -

- Scissors
- Pva glue
- Foam pads
- File





To make the blue card I covered the card with the patterned paper and tore some co-ordinating paper, sticking it to the bottom of the card. I used the edge of the patterned paper to use as a frill for the top of the card.

Again I cut out two spaceships, one was adhered with glue, the other with foam pads for dimension. Chipboard alphas were used for my wording.

All done -Quick and easy for Daddy's Day
