

## Mirror, mirror on the wall .....



To create this magical mirror you will need:

Bare wooden framed mirror (IKEA), Acrylic paints (Yellow/blue/orange/white), Glitter glue, white cord, ribbon, embellishments, buttons, white card, small peg

Tools: Computer/printer, Glue gun, sponge



1. Start by white washing the wooden base with a light coating of white acrylic paint, to lighten the wooden look.
2. Using a piece of sponge gently tap around the edges of the frame with blue/white mix acrylic paint.

3. Using a small, roughly torn piece of bubble wrap, sponge yellow/orange paint onto it; place onto opposite corners and press lightly but evenly before removing gently to reveal a lovely dotty pattern.
4. Next gently apply iridescent glitter glue around the frame and the frame joins to give the project some lovely sparkle. Leave to dry.
5. Wrap some white cord around the top of the frame twice and tie into a knot. Place a piece of ribbon about 10cm long over the cord and knot again. Allow the cord to hang freely. Once you are happy with the wrapping, glue the cord using a glue gun to the frame at the rear to hold it in place.
6. Arrange some co-ordinating embellishments/buttons around two edges of the mirror. Once you are happy with them, glue them into place, again using a glue gun for a good, strong hold. Then apply glitter glue to some of the buttons.
7. Finally in MS Word, create the "Mirror, mirror on the wall ....." In a frame, add some colour, print and cut out. Attach 2 eyelets to the end and thread ribbon through to attach it to the white cord. Use a simple double knot to keep it in place.
8. **An added extra!!!** You know how often we think to ourselves, "I must remember to do that in the morning"? Well, now you can set yourselves little reminders by attaching little notelets to the cord using the little peg embellishment provided. Let's face it, we all look in the mirror in the morning, so you'll never forget another thing!
