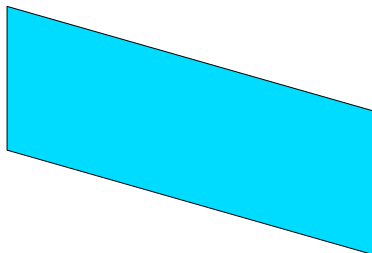




Decopatch Noticeboard

Materials & Tools:

- Pink & blue pattern Decopatch paper
- Decopatch Glue
- Decopatch Varnish
- Decopatch Brush
- Noticeboard
- Scissors
- Chipboard piece
- White mounting board
- Cuttlebug Machine
- Cuttlebug Harmony Alphabet Dies
- Stapler
- Hole Punch

Instructions:

1. Cut one sheet of Decopatch paper into diagonal strips as on the left – they need to be just long enough to cover the front and side of the frame and add a little extra to glue underneath.
2. Starting just in from one corner, glue the strips to the frame. Overlap each piece slightly.
3. Glue strips around the whole of the frame – leaving the corners uncovered.
4. Using a squared piece of Decopatch paper, cover the corners of the frame, folding the paper round the corners and gluing in place.
5. Once it is full dry, give it a coat of varnish.



5. Using the Cuttlebug cut out the lettering for your title from the white mounting board.

6. Cut the chipboard so that it is long enough to fit your title and a hole at either side.

7. Using straight pieces of Decopatch paper cover your chipboard.

8. Once the backing is dry, using your stapler, staple the letters to the backing board.

9. Punch a hole in either end – these will allow you to pin it to your noticeboard.



You can use your noticeboard for any use you see fit and change the title to reflect that. I have used my notice board for inspirations. I have just collected lots of pictures that I find inspirational and have pinned them in place.

You could use your noticeboard for reminders – add pretty coloured papers with your reminders on and add a printed calendar for the month's important events.

You could also use it to display your children's artwork – creating a title piece for each child's name and display their work around it.
