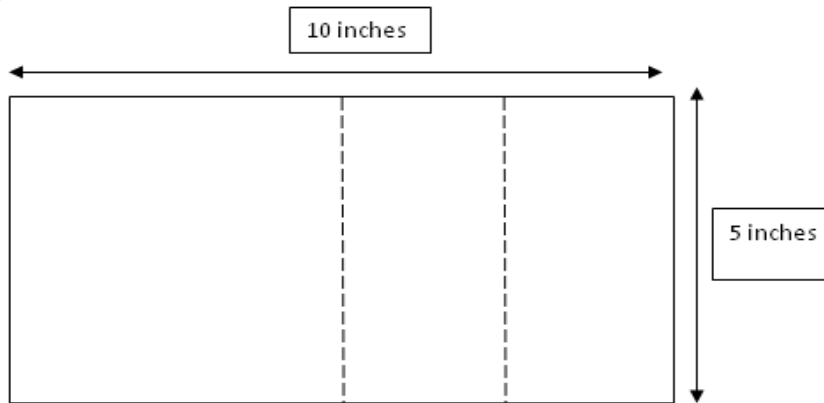


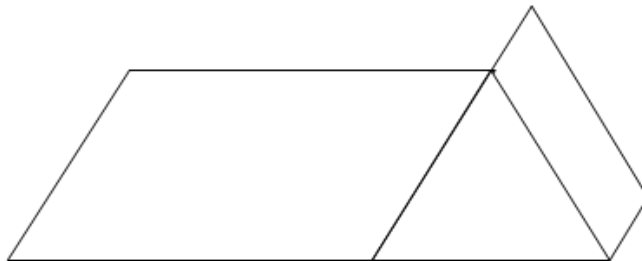
Making an Easel Card

An easel card is really simple to make and looks like it has taken you hours!

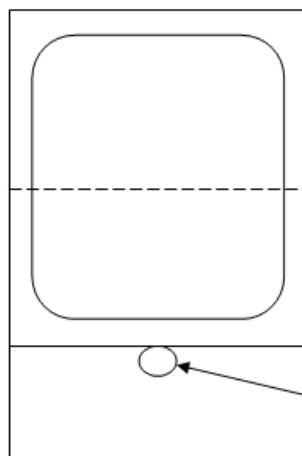
Here's how:



1. Cut a 10 x 5 inch piece of card and score at 2.5 and 5 inches (see dashed lines above).
2. Fold the first score line towards you and again with the second score line. It should look like this:



3. Cut a 5 inch square piece of card, decorate and attach to the first flap like so:



The dashed line you see here represents the flap underneath the card that has been attached.

To attach the card, place double sided tape onto this flap and carefully position your card in place and press down to secure.

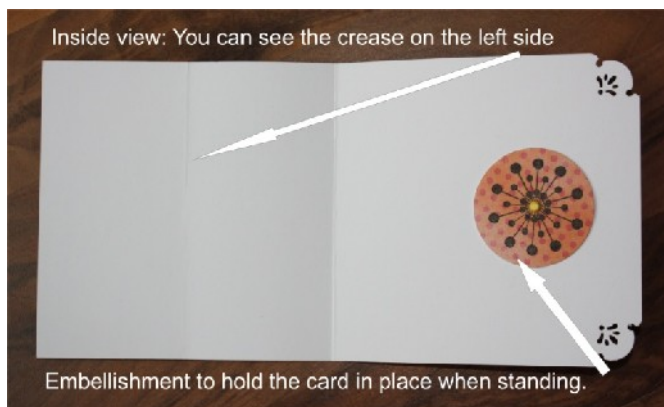
Add a button to hold the front panel in place

4. To complete your card you need to attach a brad, button or something that will hold your front panel in place when standing.

5. Your easel card is now complete! The card when folded down will fit perfectly in a normal envelope so no extra work required.

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What I used: Papermania Textured card stock, Funky Fairy “Dots are Distressing” printed papers, White card, Papertrey Inc sentiment stamp, Stamped image, Promarkers, Sakura clear glitter pen, Nestabilities Circle dies, White lace, adhesive gems, stapler/staples, Wood ware corner punch, Anita’s Snowflake stamp, Papermania brad.



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
